day of JANUARY 20 2024 **25TH** This Agreement is made on this BETWEEN DONALD MWIJAGE KATAKWEBA(Name) of P.O. BOX 8749 Region DAR ES SALAAM (hereinafter referred to as the PROPRIETOR) the expression which includes his assignees, agents or his legal representative of his business, of one part; AND _a registered pharmacist in charge who MICHAEL VINCENT SHAIDI supervises a business of a pharmacist (hereinafter referred to as the SUPERINTENDENT) of another part. WHEREAS the Proprietor wishes to establish and operate a business of a pharmacist which is a regulated business under the Act AND WHEREAS in compliance with section 43 of the Act the Proprietor wishes to engage the professional services of a pharmacist to be in charge of his business; AND WHEREAS the Superintendent is willing to offer professional services to the proprietor in lieu of remuneration for such services or such other terms and conditions as stipulated hereunder; AND WHEREAS the proprietor and superintendent (together referred as the Parties) are desirous to enter into an agreement, to establish and operate a business of a pharmacist at the terms and conditions as hereinafter appearing; AND WHEREAS the Parties agree to establish and operate a business of a pharmacist styled **NODY'S PHARMACY** Pharmacy.

AGREEMENT FOR EMPLOYMENT TO OPERATE A BUSINESS OF A PHARMACIST

AND NOW WHEREFORE THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS;

1. Interpretation:

In this Agreement, unless the contrary intention appears, the following words shall denote the meaning assigned to them:

Act means the Pharmacy Act, [Cap 311 R:E 2002] Laws of Tanzania.

Agreement means this Agreement between the parties to establish and operate a business of Pharmacist.

Business of pharmacy or pharmacist includes professional pharmacy practice and any activity carried on by a person in relation to medicines, medical devices or herbal medicines;

"Council means the Pharmacy Council established under section 3 of the Act.

Pharmacy means any approved premises wher: n or from which any services pertaining to the practice of a pharmacist is provided, and shall include a community Pharmacy, consultant Pharmacy, institutional Pharmacy or wholesale Pharmacy.

Pharmacist means a person registered as such u: der section 16 of the Act.

Proprietor means an owner of Pharmacy who s registered as such under the Tanzania Food, Drugs and Cosmetics Act of 2003 and includes his a signees, agents or his legal representatives.

Registrar means Registrar of the Council appoir ed under Section 11 of the Act

Superintendent means a Pharmacist In-Charge : f the business of a pharmacist who supervises a pharmacy and is registered as such by the Council ut der the Act.

Transfer of ownership means any dispositio of ownership of the facility subject of this agreement to a third party either by way of sale, laise, or any other form, which has the effect of changing or transferring power of authority of σ vning of pharmacy to a third person during existence of its operation

2. Duration of Agreement

This Agreement shall be effective for a period of three (3) months, commencing from the 25TH day of JANUARY 20 24 of JANUARY 20 25

3. Commencement of Supervision

The superintendent shall commence management and supervision of the above named Pharmacy on the 25TH day of JANUARY 20 24

4. Obligation of the Parties:

4.1 The Proprietor:

The proprietor shall have the following duties and responsibilities;

- 4.1.1 The **PROPRIETOR** shall pay monthly a lowance/emoluments of **TZS 800,000** payable to the **SUPERINTI**, **VDENT** upon discharging his duties and functions as p: this Agreement.
 - (a) Provided that the said allowance shall be net off any applicable taxes and/or deductible employment benefits at I shall be paid in monthly basis, and no later than the **1**stday of the following month, unless the delay in payment is communicated to the Superintender, and has accepted to the delay.
 - (b) Where the Proprietor fails to pay: monthly allowance to the Superintendent for ten (10) days without any justifia: le cause, the Superintendent shall treaty such late payment as a breach of controct and the matter may be taken to court for appropriate legal measure at the expenses of the Proprietor.

- 4.1.2 The Proprietor shall be responsible for purchasing or buying all reference materials necessary for the discharge of the business of a pharmacist and shall ensure at all times the availability of all necessary reference and other relevant materials necessary for provision of pharmaceutical services and operations.
- 4.1.3 The Proprietor shall comply with the Laws, Regulations, Guidelines and standards prescribed by the Council and other relevant authorities.
- 4.1.4 Implement and ensure that standards required for pharmacy and pharmaceutical properties are maintained in high level at all times.
- 4.1.5 The Proprietor shall hire pharmaceutical personnel for providing services or dispensing personnel recognized by the Council.
- 4.1.6 The Proprietor shall apply adequate funds necessary to rehabilitating or modifying the present premises and maintaining the modern pharmacy practice.
- 4.1.7 The Proprietor shall follow up and implement on matters advised by a Superintendent on professional and matters related to provision of good pharmaceutical services.
- 4.1.8 The Proprietor shall ensure pharmaceutical services are provided with due care and ensure all proper records are maintained and managed well.
- 4.1.9 The Proprietor shall be responsible to report to the Council on poor attendance, service provided or malpractices done by the Superintendent.
- 4.1.10 The Proprietor shall purchase and ensure availability of all necessary tools for pharmacy operations are in place, which includes but not limited to availability of Superintendent log book, PC logo, dispensing register, ledgers etc.
- 4.1.11 The Proprietor shall not interfere with the performance of professional matters in the premises or cause non-performance of professional services in the pharmacy.
- 4.1.12 The Proprietor shall ensure all purchases or procurement and deliverables of pharmacy items are signed by a Superintendent for proper records and professional accuracy.
- 4.1.13 Perform any other duty as the Council may determine from time to time for proper conduct and management the business of pharmacist.

4.2 The Superintendent;

For an allowance or emolument stipulated in clause 4.1.1 of this Agreement, the Superintendent shall, with all commitment and professional diligence, take the necessary steps to establish and efficiently supervise the said pharmacy, dealing in Pharmaceuticals.

The superintendent shall have the following duties and obligations: -

- 4.2.1 Shall obtain from the Council and of er appropriate authorities collect the requisite licenses, permits and authorization are keep the pharmacy within the standards and conditions as contained in any writter law that regulate and control the business of a pharmacist.
- 4.2.2 Shall ensure physical supervision of the said premises at a minimum of 15 hours in 7 days of the week. Full time pharmacist is more preferable.
- 4.2.3 Shall implement and ensure that standards required for pharmacy and pharmaceutical properties are maintained in high level at all times.
- 4.2.4 Shall manage and undertake all technical and professional matters in the pharmacy.
- 4.2.5 Shall supervise and control all pharma eutical personnel work in the pharmacy and ensure day-to-day functions of the pharmacy abide to the law.
- 4.2.6 Shall facilitate capacity building to all pharmaceutical personnel that supervises the pharmacy.
- 4.2.7 Shall provide pharmaceutical service with lue care.
- 4.2.8 Shall ensure all proper records are maintained and managed in accordance to good pharmacy practice standards.
- 4.2.9 Shall ensure availability of all necessary reference and other relevant materials necessary for provision of pharmaceutical services and operations are in place.
- 4.2.10 Shall report to the Council on any malpractices or violations done by the Proprietor.
- 4.2.11 Shall ensure availability of all necessary pols for pharmacy operations are in place, i.e. Superintendent logbook, PC logo, dispensing register, ledgers etc.
- 4.2.12 Must ensure whoever is on duty shall appear on a white coat and name tag on it.

- 4.2.13 Shall establish a well-organized management body of the pharmacy of which he supervises.
- 4.2.14 Shall ensure that all certificates (business permit, premises registration, copy of certificate of a Superintendent and any other certificates from other authorities are conspicuously displayed in the premises.
- 4.2.15 Shall ensure medicines, medical supplies and other pharmacy items are properly arranged and kept in compliance with good pharmacy practice standards.
- 4.2.16 Shall perform any other duty as the Council may determine.

5. Termination

- 5.1 This Agreement shall be terminated:
 - (a) by automatic termination;
 - (b)by mutual consent, or
 - (c) by Notice
- 5.2 The Agreement may automatically be terminated:
 - (i) after the expiry of a term fixed under Clause 2 of this Agreement unless otherwise the parties agree to renew the terms of the agreement.
 - (ii) If the Council cancels the licence, or suspends or removes the name of a Superintendent from the Register due to professional misconducts in accordance with section 45 of the Act.
 Notwithstanding the requirement of this Clause, where termination is due to the cancellation of the Superintendent s licence, or suspension or removal from the Register, Roll or List of Pharmacists, all benefits, allowances or claims due to the Superintendent for the work done for any such of days before the cancellation, suspension or removal shall be paid by the Proprietor prior to termination.
- 5.3 The Agreement may be terminated at any time by mutual agreement or consent between the parties when they find it appropriate that the agreement be terminated. Provided that where the Agreement is terminated by mutual consent, all claims or allowance due to the **Superintendent** shall be paid in full by the Proprietor prior to termination.

- 5.4 The Agreement may be terminated by 1 otice:
 - (i) By either party by giving a one (1) month written notice to the other party of the intention to terminate the *A* greement;
 - (ii) By either party by yielding to the other party one month in lieu of a notice as required under Clause 5.4 (i) above.

Provided that a written notice under this clause shall be addressed to the other part and copy shall be submitten to the Registrar for notification.

- Notification of termination of the contract to the Registrar shall be accompanied with reasons of termination.
- The Parties agree that the Council shall not be obligated to issue another notice of termination but a closure order as per the Act.

6. Dispute Settlement

- 6.1 In the event of dispute in connection with this agreement both parties will make every effort to resolve the matter amicably.
- 6.2 If amicable settlement becomes imposs ble, then, an aggrieved party may seek legal remedy.
- 6.3 Nothing in clause 6 (6.1) and (6.2) shall prevent the Proprietor or Superintendent from initiating or proceeding to the Commission for Mediation and Arbitration (CMA).

7. Applicable Law and Jurisdiction

- 7.1 The laws of Tanzania hereto shall govern the validity, construction and interpretation of this agreement and the rights and duties of the parties.
- 7.2 Any dispute, controversy or claim arising of or relating to this Agreement or the breach, termination or invalidity or the Agreement shall firstly be settled amicably by the parties.
- 7.3 Unless the matter is not settled in an amic; ble way within thirty (30) days from the date when the dispute arose, the matter may be taken court of competent jurisdiction for further redress.
- 7.4 in this Agreement shall preclude the making of an application to the Court for conservatory or provisional relief

8. The council will accept additional clauses but this agreement is a generic contract for guidance only.

WHEREAS the Proprietor wishes to establish and operate a business of a pharmacist which is a regulated under the Pharmacy Act.

WHEREAS in compliance with good pharma sy practice standards, the Proprietor wishes to engage the professional services of a pharmac utical Technician to his business.

WHEREAS the pharmaceutical Technician is willing to offer professional services to the proprietor in lieu of remuneration for such services or such other terms and conditions as stipulated hereunder:

WHEREAS the proprietor and pharmaceutical Technician are desirous to enter into an agreement, to establish and operate a business of a pharma sist

WHEREAS the Parties agree to establish and operate a business of a pharmacist styled as NODY'S Pharmacy.

AND NOW WHEREFORE THIS AGREEMENT VITNESSETH AS FOLLOWS;

1. Interpretation:

"Act" means the Pharmacy Act, Cap 311.

"Agreement" means the Agreement between the parties to establish and operate a business of Pharmacist.

"Business of pharmacy or pharmacist" includes professional pharmacy practice and any activity carried on by a person in relation to medicines, medical devices or herbal medicines;

"Pharmacy" means any approved premises wherein or from which any services pertaining to the practice of a pharmacist is provided, and shall include a community Pharmacy, consultant Pharmacy, institutional Pharmacy or wholesale Pr armacy.

"Proprietor" means an owner of Pharmacy and includes his assignees, agents or his legal representative.

"Superintendent" means a pharmacist in charge of the business of a pharmacist

"Pharmacist" means a person registered as such under section 16 of the Act.

Pharmaceutical Technician means a person recognized as such under regulation 27 of the pharmacy (Pharmacy Practice) Regulations, 2012

"Transfer of ownership" means any disposition of ownership of the facility subject of this agreement to a third party either by way of sale, lease, or any other form, which has the effect of changing or transferring power of authority of owning of pharmacy to a third person during existence of its operation

2. Duration of Agreement

This Agreement shall be effective for a period of twelve (12) months, commencing from the 25TH day of JANUARY 20 24 to 24TH day of JANUARY 20 25

Commencement of Supervision 3.

The pharmaceutical Technician shall commence management and supervision of the abovenamed Pharmacy on the 25TH day of JANUARY 20 24

Obligation of the Parties: 4.

4.1 The Proprietor:

The proprietor shall have the following duties and responsibilities; -

- The PROPRIETOR shall pay Monthly stipend of 500,000 TZS. FIVE HUNDRED THOUSANDS SHILLINGS payable monthly to the Pharmaceutical Technician upon discharging his duties and functions as per this Agreement. At any event, the stipend shall not be paid in advance.
- The stipend shall be net of any applicable taxes and/or deductible employment benefits 4.1.2 and shall be paid monthly and no later than the 1stday of the following month.
- 4.1.3 Comply with the Laws, Regulations, Guidelines and standards prescribed by the Pharmacy Council and other relevant authorities.
- 4.1.4 Implement and ensure that standards required for pharmacy and pharmaceutical properties are maintained in high level at all times.
- 4.1.5 Apply adequate funds necessary to rehabilitating or modifying the present premises and maintaining the modern pharmacy practice.
- 4.1.6 Follow up and implement on matters advised by a Superintendent on professional and matters related to provision of good pharmaceutical services.

- 4.1.7 Shall ensure pharmaceutical services are provided with due care.
- 4.1.8 Shall ensure all proper records are maintained and managed well.
- 4.1.9 Shall ensure availability of all ne essary reference and other relevant materials necessary for provision of pharma: sutical services and operations.
- 4.1.10 Shall purchase and ensure availability of all necessary tools for pharmacy operations are in place, i.e Superintendent log book, PC logo, dispensing register, ledgers etc.
- 4.1.11 Shall not interfere with the performance of professional matters in the premises or cause non-performance of professional services in the pharmacy.
- 4.1.12 Shall ensure all purchases or procurement and deliverables of pharmacy items are signed by a superintendent.
- 4.1.13 Shall be responsible for buying all reference materials
- 4.1.14 Perform any other duty as the Council may determine from time to time.

4.2 The Pharmaceutical Technician

At a stipend stipulated in clause 4.1.1 of this Agreement, the Pharmaceutical Technician shall, with all commitment and profession all diligence, take the necessary steps to establish and efficiently supervise the said pharma; y, dealing in Pharmaceuticals.

The Pharmaceutical Technician shall have the following duties and obligations: -

- 4.2.1 Shall implement and ensure that standards required for pharmacy and pharmaceutical properties are m.: ntained in high level at all times.
- 4.2.2 Shall manage and undertake all te: nnical and professional matters in the pharmacy.
- 4.2.3 Shall provide pharmaceutical serve e with due care.
- 4.2.4 Shall ensure all proper records are pharmacy practice standards
- 4.2.5 Shall report to the Superintendent Pharmacy Council on any malpractices or violations done by the Proprietor.
- 4.2.6 Shall ensure medicines, medical supplies and other pharmacy items are properly arranged and kept in compliance with good pharmacy practice standards.

Termination 5.

Unless otherwise terminated by either party, this Agreement shall be terminated upon expiry of the contract.

This agreement may be terminated by mutual agreement between the parties and or any party upon issuing a written notice of one month to the other party of his intention to terminate contract or one-month stipend in lieu thereof.

The written notice shall be addressed to the other party and copy shall be submitted to the Registrar, Pharmacy Council for notification.

Notification of termination of the contract to the Registrar shall be accompanied with reasons of termination.

The Parties agree that the Council shall not be obligated to issue another notice of termination but a closure order as per the Act.

Dispute Settlement

- In the event of dispute in connection with this agreement both parties will make every 6.1 effort to resolve the matter amicably.
- If amicable settlement becomes impossible, then, an aggrieved party may seek legal 6.2 remedy.
- Nothing in clause 6 (6.1) and (6.2) shall prevent the Proprietor or Pharmaceutical 6.3 Technician from initiating or proceeding to The Commission for the Mediation and Arbitration (CMA).

7. Costs

The Proprietor shall meet the cost of drawing up this Agreement.

- 8. The laws of Tanzania hereto shall govern the validity, construction and interpretation of this agreement and the rights and duties of the parties.
- 9. The Pharmacy Council will accept additional clauses but this Agreement is a generic contract for guidance only.
